

Diagnose Your CV Like a French Recruiter

☐ Ask AI to audit your CV using the prompt:
"You're a LinkedIn recruiter in France. Review my profile and CV. Highlight weak points and suggest improvements for each section."
□ Ensure your tone isn't too assertive (avoid overusing "led", "managed" for junior roles)
Keep your CV layout clean, minimalist, and structured (1 page max)
Reverse-Engineer the Job Description
Use AI to extract keywords and verbs from the job ad:
"Pull out key skills and match them to my CV experience."
Build a personal vocabulary bank with French verbs relevant to your target role
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- Ask yourself "Can someone skim my CV in 8 seconds and know what I'm good at?"
- Copy → Paste → Match. Use AI to extract action verbs and keywords from a real French job ad. Then rewrite your CV to mirror the language (in French or English, depending on the role).

Rewrite Bullet Points For Clarity ☐ Use this prompt: "Rewrite these bullet points using STAR. Make them skimmable and culturally appropriate for France." ☐ Use this format: **Action + Context + Result** (e.g. "Organised an internal event for 50 people, strengthening team cohesion.") ☐ Avoid vague verbs like "handled tasks" or "supported operations" Craft a Personal Brand Summary (En-tête) ☐ Use this prompt: "Write an About section using the R-C-A-R structure and a tone French recruiters expect." ☐ Structure: • **Reason**: Who are you / what do you want? - Always include a short pitch in your emails or LinkedIn messages. Make them want to open your CV!
